I did two different samples (can you tell I love cats!). The nice thing about the grid technique is that you can create whatever design you want, there is no set pattern you have to follow. You can stay within the lines of the grid you create or cross over into the next grid, there is no right or wrong with this technique.

Materials:

Cardstock (experiment with white first and then try other colors)

Different cardstock for layering and the card itself

Black ink to stamp images (really, you can use any color)

Other colored ink pads (I use Marvy Matchables for everything but you can use any brand of ink)

Post-It Notes (easier to work with because they stick in place while you are working)

Stamps (these can vary in number and size according to the design you want to create and the size of paper)

Stamp an image and mark it off with post-it notes. Drag, stipple or sponge inks starting from the post-it note onto the card. Repeat the process with another stamp until you have filled the card and/or created the look you want.

After creating my design I lightly stippled over the whole card to fill in some of the white spaces.
