

## Reflection Technique

Using dye ink, stamp your image onto cardstock.

Using the same stamp and ink, stamp onto a piece of acetate. Be careful, the ink will not dry.

Hold the acetate so that the inked side is facing down and rotate it so that the image is showing upside down. Now, carefully align it so that the bottom of the image on the acetate is almost touching the bottom of the stamped image on the cardstock and gently place it down onto the cardstock. Hold it firmly in place and gently rub the back of the acetate so that the ink will transfer onto the cardstock. Remove the acetate and you should have 2 images that are a mirror image of each other.



To create the illusion of water, brayer clear embossing ink or Versamark ink over the upside down image and bottom of the cardstock only. Sprinkle on Glassy Glaze embossing powder or clear ultrathick embossing powder and heat set.

Variation: Kissing fish - stamp a fish onto cardstock. Use the acetate trick, but position the “reflected” image side-by-side with the first one so that their lips are touching. No embossing, please! You can create 2 people holding hands, etc. Now you can stamp a mirror image of any stamp!
